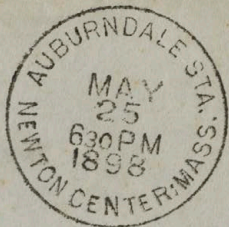
Dear Miss Whitney:

I cherish your latest good letters, and may yet rule my life according! But an aunt of mine is going to Maine next month, to be alone (save and excepting dogs!) most of the summer, and wants me to go with her. We have just begun to talk seriously of it. I have two rather heavy pieces of work hanging over me: a job each, in editing and translating; and I have hedged shamefully, so far, and put them off until that hoped-for day when what I am pleased to call my mind shall revive. And now it seems as if I should attack them at once, and

never let up, however unintelligent
the result, until they be done
for. I know I should have a
heavenly asylum, for my fell
"literary purposes", with you at
Shelburne: only I never can work
away from home comforts, and
my Kith and Kin.

Miss Manning and you: throwing
Kisses in the best manner of the
